**Jan. 16, 2017 (Columbus, Ind.)** – Please take notice that the Columbus Indiana Philharmonic has changed the venue for the upcoming concert *Jazzy Blue with Di Wu* to:

The performance is scheduled for Saturday, February 4, 2017 at 7:30 p.m. The concert is being moved from Columbus North High School Judson S. Erne Auditorium while the space undergoes extensive cleaning and repair following the fire in early December.

The Columbus Indiana Philharmonic will divide Robbins Auditorium seating into four zones that best compare to the zone arrangements at Erne Auditorium. Patrons who have already purchased tickets will be reissued tickets to communicate new seat assignments.
