Dec. 6, 2016 (Columbus, Ind.) – Please take notice that the Columbus Indiana Philharmonic has changed the venue for the upcoming two holiday concerts on Sunday, December 11, 2016 to:

The two performances - *Philharmonic Holidays! with The Wright Brothers* - are scheduled for Sunday, December 11, 2016 at 3:00 p.m. and 7:00 p.m. The change of venue is necessary following Monday's fire at Columbus North High School affecting Judson S. Erne Auditorium.

Due to differing auditorium seat numbering arrangements, seating will be General Admission at both concerts. Ticket-holders are advised to arrive early for the best seat selections. Doors will open at 2:20 p.m. for the 3:00 p.m. matinee performance and 6:15 p.m. for the 7:00 p.m. concert. Volunteer ushers will be available to help patrons navigate the space.

Single tickets can be purchased by calling the Philharmonic Box Office at 812-376-2638 x1. Student and senior discounts are available. Tickets will also be available for purchase at the door. Will Call tickets can be picked up at the Columbus Indiana Philharmonic Box Office at 315 Franklin Street in downtown Columbus until Friday, December 9 at 5:00 p.m. Will Call tickets will also be available for pick-up in the auditorium lobby before each performance.
