
about MELISSA GARCIA

Additionally, she is on the summer staff of the Heartland Youth Choir in Des Moines, Iowa where she serves as conductor of the Summer Tunes Choir and teaches Kodály Musicianship classes.

Mrs. Garcia is the lower school music teacher at Park Tudor, a private school in Indianapolis. Mrs. Garcia's teaching career spans from pre-school music through high school choral programs. Prior to her work in Indiana, Mrs. Garcia was the Associate Director of the Northern California Children's Choir where she also served as an elementary music educator. While living in Iowa, she served as a private voice teacher and instructor for the Heartland Youth Choir in Des Moines, and as a music instructor for the Des Moines Children's Choruses and the Iowa Youth Chorus. In addition, she served as a director for the middle school and high school choral department in Earlham, Iowa. While a student at Iowa State University, she held an internship position as the Assistant Conductor for the Preparatory Choir with the Ames Children's Choir. Mrs. Garcia received her BME from Iowa State University in 2005. In addition, she has completed her Kodály Certification from Indiana University. She recently served as a Co-President of Indiana Kodály Educators. Mrs. Garcia has presented at ACDA regionally and this year nationally. Her passion is inspiring others to continue in Music Education.

described as "large, full, warm, and lush."


Juliet has a doctoral degree in voice performance from Indiana University's Jacob's School of Music, where she received many awarded scholarships. While at IU, she performed the role of Alice Ford in Verdi's Falstaff, opposite Timothy Noble, and premiered the role of Mrs. Webb, in Ned Rorem's opera version of Our Town. Her work in Our Town earned her favorable mention in The New York Times and Opera News. She has released a solo album, titled I know Where I'm goin, and is currently preparing to release her first song as a singer-songwriter, titled "In the Hands of God".

Juliet has always been active in her church community, organizing music events, directing church choirs and orchestras for special events, as well as spearheading regional musical youth programs and performances.

Juliet currently teaches at IUPUC in Columbus, Indiana. She also teaches privately and owns her own voice teaching studio, Gilchrist Music Studio, operating in Columbus and Bloomington, Indiana. She has taught at Vincennes University, in Vincennes, Indiana and Lincoln Trail College, in Robinson, Illinois. Molly is a two-time winner of the Anna Newell Brown Award for Vocal Excellence, a performance contest in Bartholomew County for high school students studying vocal and instrumental musical interests. She attended the High School Classical Voice Institute at the prestigious Brevard Music Center in Brevard, North Carolina in the summers of 2022 and 2023 and is now a member of the Central Michigan University Chamber Singers - the university's top auditioned ensemble.
